CJJ Continues to Be in Solid Financial Health

Despite the pandemic, CJJ has solidified funding from new and ongoing donors:

- \$150,000 over three years (2020, 2021, 2022) from the Andrus Family Foundation
- \$80,000 over two years (2020, 2021) from the Tow Foundation

PPP loan also helped bridge the gap over the summer. Loan has been forgiven. Did not receive second round PPP.

State memberships continue to grow annually, as do individual and organizational memberships.


Covidrelated budgetary challenges and offsets


- One in-person convening instead of three
- Offset by reduced travel costs (nearly \$10,000 in savings)
- Phasing out physical office space (2021 savings of \$23,772)
- Savings and new grants that were secured resulted in being able to hire one additional FT staff person. (Helping support Western Region, R/ED and ECD Committees, Government Relations,
- Returning to in-person gatherings with limited hybrid option going forward.
