### **CJJ Continues to Be in Solid Financial Health**

Despite the pandemic, CJJ has solidified funding from new and ongoing donors:

- \$150,000 over three years from the Andrus Family Foundation
- \$80,000 over two years from the Tow Foundation
- \$60,000 in new funding from the Annie E. Casey Foundation
- Current application out with the Raikes Foundation


PPP loan also helped bridge the gap over the summer

Conference registrations are at their highest numbers ever, despite loss of second in-person convening for the year.

State memberships continue to grow annually, as do individual and organizational memberships.

# Covid-related budgetary challenges and offsets

- One in-person convening instead of three
- Offset by reduced travel costs (nearly \$10,000 in savings)
- Phasing out physical office space (2021 savings of \$23,772)




As of Q3, modified cash basis.

# **Organizational Highlights**

- SAG memberships continue to be strong. (Currently 40 paid or committed states; \$179,000)
- Interest in conferences and training sessions is on the rise. (386 registrants for Annual Conference in 2018; 475 registered for Annual Conference in 2019; almost 650 registered in 2020.)
- Pursuing new and continued grants partnerships.
- Individual and organizational memberships on the rise: by September, 2020 memberships for these other categories were more than 3x budgeted numbers.

- Continue to Support the Expansion of Membership Outside SAGS
- Further Diversify Funding
